1. Background

- 1.1 Young People from the Isles of Scilly do not have a Year 12 and 13 provision on the Islands. Unlike any of their peers from other areas, they are required to leave home at 16 to attend colleges, boarding schools and some apprenticeships. The Isles of Scilly Community Safety Partnership runs a Preparing for Adulthood scheme to support 16 year olds moving to the mainland in a safe way
- 1.2 Historically the Isles of Scilly CSP funded a safeguarding project each year for students who are leaving for the mainland because there is no sixth form on the islands.

2. Decision record

- 2.1 The OPCC will award £5,000 to the Isles of Scilly Community Safety Partnership to support the Preparing for Adulthood project. This recognises the distance residents on the islands have to travel to the mainland and the challenges faced by its young people in attending further education.

3. Consultation, engagement and communication

- 3.1 This grant has been given as a special case following consultation between the Isles of Scilly Community Safety Partnership and the Police and Crime Commissioner as a one-off grant to enable the Isles of Scilly to determine a more sustainable option going forward.
- 3.2 The course aims to assist Year 10 pupils to be better prepared in knowledge and resilience for their move to the mainland, prepare for independent living, experience colleges and independent activities and result in improved emotional resilience, reduction in risk taking and offending behaviour, awareness of the risks of exploitation.

4. OPCC Monitoring Officer advice

4.1 Legal, Management and Equality Implications – Current and Future

The PCC's Monitoring Officer has advised that the arrangements set out in the proposal satisfy the requirements of awarding a capital grant.
