Request:

- 1. On what date did Mark Kingscote submit his resignation?
- 2. On what date did Mark Kingscote's resignation take effect?
- 3. What was the contractual notice that Mark Kingscote was required to give in order to resign?
- 4. Was Mark Kingscote subject to a probationary period, and if so, what period did this cover?
- 5. In addition could you provide details of the areas of work covered and the outcomes achieved by the Mark Kingscote during his tenure as Deputy Commissioner.

I can confirm that the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner holds the information you have requested, however I consider that this information is exempt under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This exemption is engaged because this request relates to personal information. Section 40(2) is an absolute exemption and therefore does not require the application of a Prejudice or Public Interest Test.

3. What was the contractual notice that Mark Kingscote was required to give in order to resign?

Contractual notice for an OPPC employee at a senior level within the first 6 months of their employment is one month. However, this is subject to negotiation with the OPCC Head of Paid Service.

4. Was Mark Kingscote subject to a probationary period, and if so, what period did this cover?

Mark Kingscote was subject to a probationary period. All OPCC staff are required to undertake a 6-month probationary period from the date of employment.
