We went to the market directly via Bluelight. It was published on 7th April 2022. The award criteria was based on the 'Most Economically Advantageous Tender' evaluated on 40% Qualitative scores and 60% price. The deadline for the return tenders was 9th May 2022 and the intention to award letter was sent via Bluelight on 24th May 2022. The contract was awarded using the Force Standard Terms and Conditions for the supply of goods and services together with the Force Special Terms and Conditions 2021 v6 for the appointment of Contractors for Estates Contracts. Due to complexity of the project, the contract value was difficult to calculate but a best guess estimate was circa £500k at the time. Likewise, the duration of the contract was also an unknown timescale and was to be negotiated with the preferred contractor.
