# 1. Background

1.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner has a declared intention to reduce the harm from drugs and alcohol in her Police and Crime Plan. Amber Centres are abstinent based environments where residents are tested for drug and alcohol use and are expected to abstain. However they are not a rehabilitation service and do not offer treatment or intervention to those with substance misuse or addiction issues. Instead, residents are encouraged and supported to access specialist support from external organisations. All residents are expected to participate in the employability and well-being programme as a mandatory condition of their stay.

#### Support would include:

- Develop new skills, experiences and has the time to focus on themselves
- Training and education opportunities
- Employment skills
- Support with finding a sustainable place to call home

The Amber foundation can accept referrals from those who are in recovery from drug and alcohol abuse.

### 2. Decision Record

To issue a 2-year community safety grant to The Amber Foundation to support young adults (aged 18-30) facing complex problems and offer homeless support.

The estimated Whole Life Cost value £96,000 (£48K per year for 2 years).
