1. Background

- 1.1 The Plymouth Against Retail Crime (PARC) initiative is an established collaboration bringing together the police, City Centre Company, Plymouth City Council and Storenet Radio Link. Their mission is to create a safe and secure retail environment for both businesses and customers in Plymouth. This expansion plan provides a robust framework for tackling retail crime in Plymouth.
- 1.2 As part of the Police and Crime Plan priorities the Commissioner is funding a range of interventions to support businesses and increase safety in towns across Devon and Cornwall Police area.
- 1.3 This grant will enable businesses to access PARC membership in a further 10 areas outside of the immediate Plymouth city centre boundary.
- 1.4 These target areas include:
 - a) Devonport, Stoke, Keyham, St Budeaux, Milehouse
 - b) Barbican, The Waterfront
 - c) Mutley, Laira, Peverell, Efford, Cattedown
 - d) Plympton, Marsh Mills, Newnham
 - e) Plymstock, Billacombe, Mount Batten, Elburton, Stadiscombe, Oreston
 - f) Ivybridge, Sherford, Sparkwell
 - g) Crownhill, Southway, West Park, Woolwell
 - h) Smithaleigh, Hemerdon
 - i) Estover, Leigham, Eggbuckland
 - j) Yealmpton
- 1.5 The expansion plan consists of two implementation phases:
 - Phase 1 (November 2025 to March 2026) implement PARC membership expansion to areas a,b and c
 - Phase 2 (April 2026 to March 2027) PARC membership expansion to areas d to j



1.6 Objectives:

- Contribute to the Police and Crime Plan priority of tackling theft and shoplifting on our high streets.
- Reduce the incidence of retail crime in Plymouth.
- Increase collaboration between retailers, law enforcement, and the community.
- Promote awareness and prevention strategies across the retail sector.
- Enhance reporting and data collection.

2. Decision Record

- 2.1 To issue an 18-month grant to PARC to support businesses to access PARC membership and crime prevention approaches in 10 areas outside of Plymouth city centre boundary.
- 2.2 Total grant value of £58,000.

3.1 A decision was made by the Police and Crime Commissioner following a meeting with PARC on 8 October 2025.
