1. Mobile Youth Bus

Community Officers Police in Plymouth have identified increasing concerns relating to antisocial behaviour involving young people within the city centre, alongside a lack of accessible youth provisions and in the areas where these issues are most prevalent.

Existing Youth Services are limited in their ability to provide flexible outreach support, where and when it is most needed

A one-off grant will contribute towards the operational costs of delivering a mobile youth bus service within Plymouth. The funding will support targeted outreach in areas experiencing anti-social behaviour, increase access to positive activities for young people, and strengthen partnership working to prevent escalation into offending, improving community safety and public confidence.

2. Decision Record

Issue a grant of £30,000 to contribute to the cost of x2 youth buses, supporting targeted outreach in areas experiencing anti-social behaviour.
